1. The Brigade will continue its march tomorrow the 8th September, 1916; in accordance with the attached March Table.
2. Representatives of billeting parties will be at the CROSS ROADS D 17 a O 2; at 12-45 pm, tomorrow, to meet troops and conduct them to their billets and areas.
3. Brigade Headquarters will close CARDONNETTE at 8 am. tomorrow, and reopen in the new area at 2-30 pm. tomorrow the 8th September 1916.
4. The Officer Commanding No 3 Field Ambulance will arrange to send an ambulance wagon to follow immediately in rear of each Infantry Battalion. The wagon will report to Battalion Headquarters half an hour before the Battalion moves off.
5. Each Battalion will leave behind in its present billeting area a rear guard of 1 officer and 16 other Ranks to collect all stragglers and absentees. These parties will follow their units after an interval of one and a half hours.
6. All 1st line Transport and baggage wagons will follow immediately in rear of their respective units.
7. The following points in March Discipline were noticed during today's march. Commanding Officers will take steps to rectify them in future.
 - (a) Too many gaps in Units, especially between transport and the rear company.
 - (b) When troops halted at Cross Roads, the cross roads were not kept clear for cross traffic.
 - (c) At each halt all troops, animals, and vehicles must move to the right of the road, and well off it if possible. It was noticed today that officers' horses were taken on to the left of the road and they blocked the traffic.
 - (d) On reaching their billets at destinations stricter march discipline must be observed by units. Troops must still be kept well in hand on the right of the road.
